The Health and Medical Care Archive (HMCA) is the data archive of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF), the largest philanthropy devoted exclusively to health and health care in the United States. Operated by the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR) at the University of Michigan, HMCA preserves and disseminates data collected by selected research projects funded by the Foundation and facilitates secondary analyses of the data. Our goal is to increase understanding of health and health care in the United States through secondary analysis of RWJF-supported data collections.

# Overview of HMCA

- Archive of publicly-accessible data supported by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.
- Preserves and disseminates data collected for selected research projects funded by RWJF.
- Operated by the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR) at the University of Michigan.
- Goal of increasing understanding of health and health care in the US by facilitating secondary analysis of RWJF-supported data collections.
- HMCA provides guidance and technical support in use of data to promote access.

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## Search / Download Holdings

### Search HMCA's Holdings

- The search engine scans the study descriptions and documentation files of every data collection.
- Searching is not case sensitive. "Dog" and "dog" return the same results.
- The search engine uses quotation marks to do phrase searching.
- If you enter multiple words, they are treated as a default Boolean "and" so you get results that have all the words. Boolean operators ("and," "or," and "not") are ignored.
- Do not use an asterisk (\*) to match partial words. The search engine automatically performs "stemming," meaning that partial-word matches should appear in search results ([more info](#)).
- Field searching has been replaced by facets, which appear in the right column on the results page.

# Agree to Terms of Use...

## Violations

If ICPSR determines that the terms of this agreement have been violated, ICPSR will act according to our [policy on terms of use violations](#). Sanctions can include:

- ICPSR may revoke the existing agreement, demand the return of the data in question, and deny all future access to ICPSR data.
- The violation may be reported to the Research Integrity Officer, Institutional Review Board, or Human Subjects Review Committee of the user's institution. A range of sanctions are available to institutions including revocation of tenure and termination.
- If the confidentiality of human subjects has been violated, the case may be reported to the Federal Office for Human Research Protections. This may result in an investigation of the user's institution, which can result in institution-wide sanctions including the suspension of all research grants.
- A court may award the payment of damages to any individual(s)/organization(s) harmed by the breach of the agreement.

## Definitions

**authorized user**

A faculty member, staff member, or student at a member institution

**ICPSR**

Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research

**member institution**

An institutional member of ICPSR

**Official/Designated Representative**

An individual appointed to represent a university's interests in ICPSR. This individual is also charged with providing user support to campus users.

**promise of confidentiality**

A promise to a respondent or research participant that the information the respondent provides will not be disseminated without the permission of the respondent; that the fact that the respondent participated in the study will not be disclosed; and that disseminated information will include no linkages to the identity of the respondent. Such a promise encompasses traditional notions of both confidentiality and anonymity. Names and other identifying information regarding respondents, proxies, or other persons on whom the respondent or proxy provides information, are presumed to be confidential.

**research subject**

A person or organization observed for purposes of research. Also called a respondent. A respondent is generally a survey respondent or informant, experimental or observational subject, focus group participant, or any other person providing information to a study or on whose behalf a proxy provides information.

- Administered online March 5 – June 5, 2013
- Sample: 1,691 NCIN Scholars who graduated prior to September, 2012
- Response rate: 31% (N = 527)
- Files that will be available include
  - Datasets in ASCII text and SPSS formats
  - Database setup syntax
  - Technical documents (e.g., codebooks)
  - Survey instruments
  - Open-ended (de-identified) responses as well as categorical data
